
Details of the Issue:

Application to increase the inner practice boundary for Bradley Stoke Surgery (L81649) and extend the outer practice boundary.

Information provided by the provider/contract holder:

Currently there are a significant number of patients (around 1,150) registered at the Practice who are located outside but very close to the inner boundary (green solid line on the attached map diagram) of the Practice, i.e. the new housing development at Charlton Hayes. Note there is no primary care facility located in the new Charlton Hayes housing development area. The proposal is to seek an extension of the Practice boundary, as indicated in the green solid area on the attached map diagram, to include those patients in the Practice's inner boundary. This will enable the Practice to provide these patients with a full range of services, including home visits.




Information provided by the (Assistant) Contract Manager:

There are currently 3 other practices which cover the same area as the proposed increase for Bradley Stoke:

- Coniston Medical Centre
- Concord Medical Centre
- Stoke Gifford Medical Centre

These three practices have all been contacted for comment on this proposal, but no response has been received.



As this area is already covered by 3 practices, it is unlikely that a 4th practice covering this area will cause any large patient movement and result in destabilisation for practices. Bradley Stoke surgery already has a significant number of patients from this area therefore approving this application will increase patient choice. The practice has a list size of 16,579 patients and 1,148 of those patients reside in the new proposed inner boundary extension. It is worth noting that patients currently residing in this proposed extension inner boundary area, are registered as full patients and not out of area patients, so do still have access to home visits and a full range of services.

The outer practice boundary will also be extended to the South as shown by the block pink area on the above map (page 1). This will ensure that the outer boundary does not cross over with the inner boundary as is currently the case.

Other Consideration (i.e. have similar decisions been made previously? Has advice been sought from other Local Regional Teams/legal/central colleagues etc.?):

The application has been sent to South Gloucestershire CCG for comment, who are in agreement with this request.

Bradley Stoke Surgery has discussed this application with their PPG who are supportive of the proposal.

Presenter's recommendation:

Approve the application to increase the practice inner and outer boundary as the practice is already serving a significant number of patients from this area. Due to the proposed boundary overlapping with 3 other practices, this is unlikely to result in any large patient movement.
